Branch Striking Competition 2015

The 2015 Striking Competition for Rural Branch Towers took place at Corston All Saints after a guick change of venue by our ringing ,aster Alan due to a wedding scheduled at 14.00 at Compton Dando that it appears no one new about?

I will do a quick scan of the rules,

1. The weather will be crisp and spring like.

This was certainly true a great sunny afternoon.

2. Everyone will have fun and not get upset even if they have a really bad day.

Overall I think this also worked except for team who failed to finish their competition piece!

3. The judges will

be a very nice person(s) and will only say nice things about the teams.

- 4. The teams will consist of six ringers but towers who are short of ringers are welcome to join together with other towers. If you look at the team photographs on the branch web site this was certainly also
- 5. Three minutes can be spent practising and rope adjusting.
- 6. Three whole pulls on the treble will be the signal for the test piece.
- 7. The test piece will be 120 changes of any method or four minutes of Call Changes - composition up to vou, initial rounds up to 1 minute will not be marked all finishing rounds will be marked.

Rules 5, 6, and 7 were all met under the eyes of Alan Coombs and Thomas Moller. 8. Everyone will encourage everyone else and wish them luck.

We started on time at 14.00 with the draw, and 10 teams entered. The ringing commenced with Mangotsfield and progressed throughout the afternoon. The number of teams increased to 13 as the afternoon went on with a junior team with most members under the age of 22 except one who happened to be the youngest person after those under 22. Bitton also entered a late team as they found they had at least three of there tower members present, and finally Lucy Bailey a recent return to ringing entered an all ladies team. Lucy used to ring at Syston in the Ken Weeks days and has recently started ring-

ing again at Frampton. Whilst the ringing was taking place tea, coffee soft drinks and cake were plentiful those waiting to ring or had already rung and waiting for the results. We probably had upwards of 50 branch ringers at the competition which is in fact more than we get at an AGM? Eventually with the sun beginning to go down the 13 teams had all completed their test piece, the bells were brought down and the judges Robert Perry and Nicki Lang had completed their deliberations it was time for the results.

Robert commented on all the teams efforts, and then Nicki Lang gave the results in reverse order as is normal.

In the end it came down to the fact that for the first four towers there were only 3 ½ faults in in it but at the final count Tytherington were the overall winners with 23 faults. Westerleigh second Mangotsfield third and Almondsbury a very close fourth.

This year we had towers entering who have certainly not entered to my knowledge in the last 20 years.

Well done to all the teams who entered and hope you had an interesting afternoon.

VE Day 70th Centenary Day Ringing

A request has been received from Government for bells to be rung to mark the 70th Anniversary of Victory in Europe (VE Day). If possible, the desire is for bells to be rung at 11 am on Saturday 9th May or alternatively at other convenient time over the weekend Friday to Sunday 8th-10th May. Although there are other demands for special ringing coming up we hope that this can be given due support. The Church of England has also been approached by Government so church authorities should be aware of the reason for additional ringing."

Tower of the year entry

For many years Pucklechurch tower has been untidy and unloved! Like many tower's the ringing room and the lower clock room a store for all types of rubbish. The ringing room walls were a variety of colours, due to different layers of peeling paint, the lath and plaster ceiling was literally hanging by a prayer, every time the 4th bell was rung the ringer attempted to dodge falling plaster which was then trodden into the carpet.

Our bells deserved a better environment.

With permission from the PCC a small group of us set about a complete renovation project. We started by removing all unwanted items. Our first job was to get scaffolding in the ringing room in order to safely take down the lath and plaster ceiling, A job noone envied, around 40sacksful were carried down the stairs as the windows were too narrow to be of use, everyone's legs aching for England it was gone leaving beams exposed which were treated, and painted matt black.

All the walls were then stripped of the flaking paint, a seemingly never ending job of "making good" all the holes, then painting lower walls with 2 coats of grey and upper magnolia.

Brilliant new lighting installed throughout the tower, the tower steps were painted, and even steam cleaned the carpet. A carpet in the middle room has been added to aid warmth and provide sound proofing along with acoustic mitigation of the clock winding mechanism by some 10dB.

Our restoration project is now on going as we plan to treat and re-paint the entire steel bell frame.

We are proud of our tower and all the work completed.

Pucklechurch has two members. It relies mainly on four ringers from Yate with whom we have amalgamated our practices and Sunday ringing, we get a couple of regular visitors.

The standard of our own band has vastly improved, In 2013 a quarter peal could only be rung if one regular was surrounded by a strong band,

In 2014 all the regular band rung quarter peals for St David's Day, All Souls Day, Our Patronal Festival, Branch 1/4 peal week, and WW1, some individuals ringing a total of 13 quarter peals of bob doubles and grandsire. For the first time in many years the bells were heard in the parish half muffled raising many positive comments from parishioners.

The bells now are requested by the PCC for many Church events, along with a request from the village to ring whilst the annual "Revel" parade takes place. In 2014 the "Revel" committee donated £300 to bell funds.

We have for the last 5yrs had ongoing fundraising collecting clothing twice a year, 2014 ~£296.00

We were proud to show off our much improved tower when we hosted the G&B Branch AGM in November.

We are now encouraged to invite visitors and prospective new ringers to Pucklehurch hopefully this will swell our membership.
